ORDER TERMINATING AUTHORIZATION TO PRACTICE LAW

Based upon the Utah Supreme Court's plenary and constitutionally granted authority to regulate the practice of law in Utah, and the tenets of Standing Order No. 15, the Utah Supreme Court orders that Truinta's authorization is terminated.

The Court has reviewed the Request to Withdraw submitted by Truinta.

In light of the Court's responsibility to the public to effectively regulate the practice of law in Utah, and in keeping with the tenets of Standing Order No. 15, the Court now orders as follows:

Any and all orders authorizing Truinta to provide services within the Utah legal regulatory sandbox (the "Sandbox") are terminated. This includes the following:

- October 12, 2022 Order for Authorization to Practice Law

In the event this entity, or any associated entity, wishes to operate within the Sandbox, it is required to seek a new authorization order through the application process.
