In re: Termination of Mina Legal Services's
Authorization Order

ORDER TERMINATING AUTHORIZATION TO PRACTICE LAW

Based upon the Utah Supreme Court's plenary and constitutionally granted authority to regulate the practice of law in Utah, and the tenets of Standing Order 15, the Utah Supreme Court orders that Mina Legal Services's authorization is terminated, effective December 31, 2024.

The Legal Services Innovation Committee has approved Mina Legal Services's request to withdraw, effective December 31, 2024.

In light of the Court's responsibility to the public to effectively regulate the practice of law in Utah, and in keeping with the tenets of Standing Order 15, the Court now orders as follows:

Any and all orders authorizing Mina Legal Services to provide services within the Utah legal regulatory sandbox (the "Sandbox") are terminated as on December 31, 2024. This includes, but is not limited to, the Order for Authorization to Practice Law dated August 10, 2022.

In the event this entity, or any associated entity, wishes to operate within the Sandbox, it is required to seek a new authorization order through the application process.
