In re: LawPal

ORDER TERMINATING PROVISIONAL AUTHORIZATION

Based upon the Utah Supreme Court's plenary and constitutionally granted authority to regulate the practice of law in Utah, and the tenets of Standing Order 15, the Utah Supreme Court orders that LawPal's provisional authorization within the Utah legal regulatory sandbox (the "Sandbox") is terminated.

On January 17, 2023, LawPal was granted an Order for Provisional Authorization for the period of 24 months, supplanting the previous Amended Order for Authorization to Practice Law granted on August 10, 2022. LawPal did not launch its services within this period, and this order has thus lapsed.

In light of the Court's responsibility to the public to effectively regulate the practice of law in Utah, and in keeping with the tenets of Standing Order 15, the Court now orders as follows:

LawPal's Order for Provisional Authorization is terminated.

In the event this entity, or any associated entity, wishes to operate within the Sandbox, it is required to seek a new authorization order through the application process.
